



## WHAT'S GOING ON WITH THE GEORGIA-PACIFIC MILL?

The Georgia-Pacific (GP) Mill and Washington State Department of Ecology (Ecology) have entered an Agreed Order to assess and clean up areas around the Camas mill site that are no longer in use, while the mill continues to operate and employ people in our communities. The Downtown Camas Association (DCA) has assembled a Community Advisory Group (CAG) to help residents and businesses engage meaningfully during this process.

The CAG's role is to serve as an information bridge between our communities, Ecology, and GP during this thorough and lengthy process. 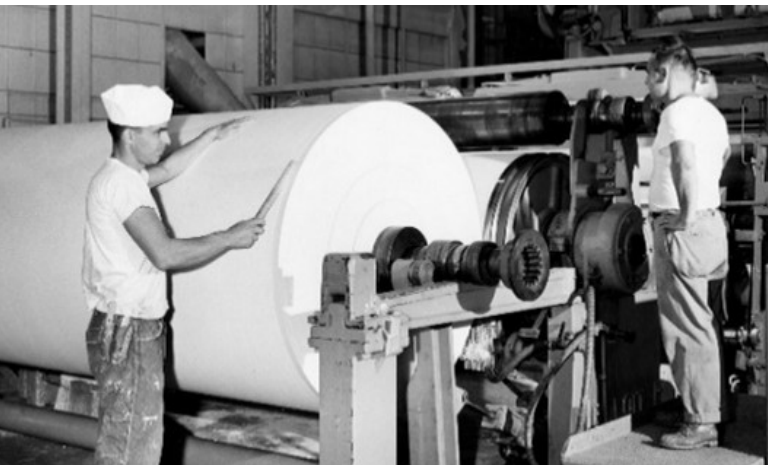

## About the cleanup process

More than a century of industrial activity at the GP paper mill in Camas has led to potential contamination in soil, sediments, and groundwater in and around the mill. Contamination could have occurred due to regular operations, spills, or leaks. Ecology and GP entered an Agreed Order in August 2021 to measure potential contamination and make a plan to clean it up.



GP will carry out cleanup activities following the Model Toxic Control Act, the law that governs cleanups in Washington state. This process includes many steps and will likely take several years to complete.
